Position Overview

This empowering work experience placement provides hands-on experience supporting food bank operations while building transferable skills in the nonprofit sector. **Supervision:** You will work under the guidance of the NBCGSS Director of EDI and Welfare (Food Bank Manager) with oversight from the Executive Director to deliver confidential food security services to UNBC students in need through our collaborative partnership with the Northern Undergraduate Student Society (NUGSS).

This role offers meaningful work that combines community impact with professional development, providing essential support to students facing food insecurity while building your career capacity in nonprofit management.

Why This Position Matters

Food insecurity affects many students due to limited income and academic demands. This role provides essential skills and paid work experience to improve your employability while addressing a critical community need, particularly for international students and marginalized populations.

Eligibility Requirements

This opportunity is open to individuals who meet ALL of the following criteria:

1. Income/Disability Assistance Status:

You must be receiving OR qualified to receive:

- BC Employment Assistance (BCEA)
- Disability Assistance (PWD/PPMB Persons with Disabilities or Persons with Persistent Multiple Barriers)
- Hardship Assistance
- Federal equivalent assistance (for Indigenous peoples on reserves or treaty lands)

2. Work Authorization:

You must be legally able to work in British Columbia

3. Commitment:

Ability to complete up to 200 hours by March 31, 2026

4. Availability:

- Thursday 11:00 AM - 3:00 PM availability required for weekly food pickups from Salvation Army Food Bank



- Hours and days will be flexible and based on needs.

Note: You will need to provide proof of eligibility (such as deposit statements, letters from your assistance provider, or equivalent documentation). If you are unsure about your eligibility, please contact WorkBC for assistance.

Key Responsibilities & Learning Opportunities

Core Food Bank Operations (60%)

- Assist with NBCGSS after-hours confidential food bank services
- Support UNBC student-specific food security programming with cultural inclusivity focus
- Help maintain confidential client intake records and usage statistics
- Support emergency food responses and special distribution events
- Assist with inventory management and food safety protocols

Collaborative Partnership Support (25%)

- Participate in planning meetings with NUGSS undergraduate representatives
- Help coordinate shared resource management under unified 'UNBC Food Bank' brand
- Engage with other UNBC departments such as Sustainability Office for food bank operations if needed.
- Support collaborative events and community initiatives

Professional Development & Administration (15%)

- Help prepare reports and documentation for NBCGSS Board of Directors
- Assist with volunteer recruitment and training coordination
- Participate in WEOG-required surveys and evaluation processes
- Engage in professional networking with student union leaders and university staff
- Following all NBCGSS's work policies such as completing NBCGSS's timesheet.
